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## Message from Principal Ostrom:

### STEM Families,

Seattle Public Schools made a hard announcement on Friday:

***“Seattle Public Schools will remain remote with limited in-person instruction through January 28, the first semester of school. This approach is in response to an increase of COVID-19 cases in King County and after consultation with Seattle Education Association, Seattle Council PTSA, and the Principals’ Association of Seattle Schools.***

*There is also no guarantee that we will be able to increase in-person instruction next semester. There are many factors that need to be considered, as we closely monitor King County COVID-19 transmission rates as well as disproportionate impacts on communities of color.”*

While not surprising, the announcement acknowledged that the challenges we face are not dissipating any time soon. My personal opinion is that it’s unlikely that even hybrid services could begin before spring unless there are dramatic shifts in transmission or vaccination probabilities. We are in this together for a long haul. Our aim is to use curriculum night meetings this week to support two-way dialogue between teachers and families about what’s working and what isn’t. Join one of the meeting opportunities below and help us support you!

There are two sessions for each class, one from 2:30-3:00pm and one in the evening from 6:00-6:30pm. Both sessions will be similar so families can choose the time slot that works best for them. There are also afternoon sessions to check in with Specialists. Grade levels are scheduled for different dates to support families with multiple children. Note that Kindergarten has a different meeting schedule from 6:30-7:30 on 10/28 with individual classroom meetings on 10/29 from 2:30-3:00. This week’s schedule is below.

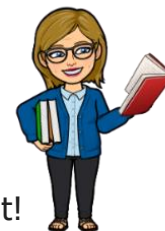

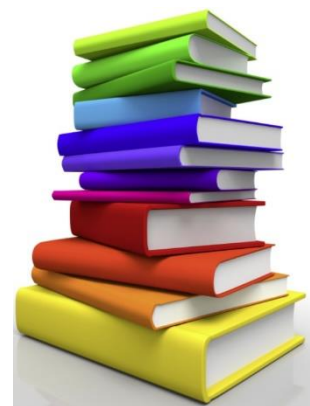

### Seattle Public Library has launched Tutor.com, a free tutoring service to library card holders!

The Seattle Public Library is launching Tutor.com today! Tutor.com has over 3,000 highly vetted expert tutors, who can help youth with schoolwork, tutoring and academic coaching in a variety of subjects in a safe and secure online classroom. 1-1 help is available in math, writing, science, history, foreign languages, college essay writing, Advanced Placement (AP) courses and more.

- Service is available 7 days a week, 2-10 p.m. in Spanish/English and 4-7 p.m. in Vietnamese
- Students can use their microphone to communicate with tutors; we hope this will be easier for English language learners
- Teens and adults can use this service to get help with filling out job applications and writing a cover letter and resume

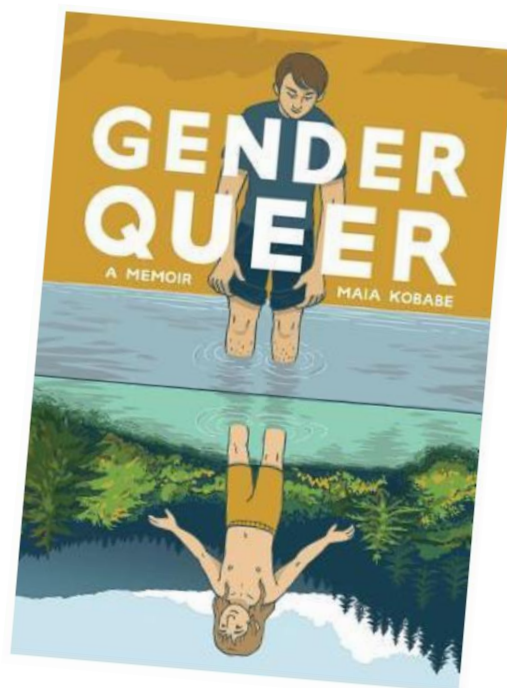
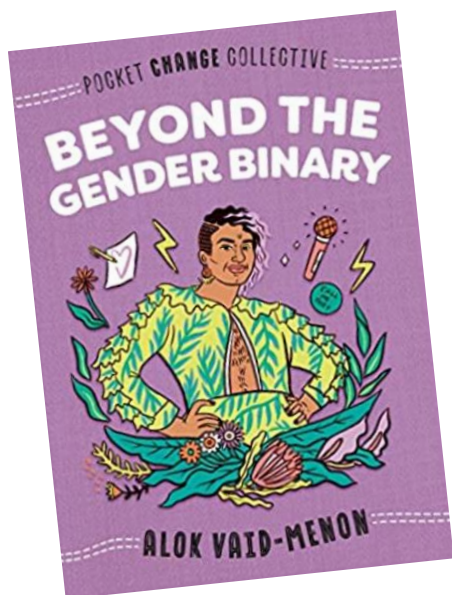

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Dear Families,

The City of Seattle has pivoted programs and services many times during the COVID-19 pandemic to ensure that we are supporting communities of color and those who have been historically underserved. Currently we are looking to serve youth who are put at a great disadvantage due to the shift to virtual learning.

We have stood up six teen virtual learning hubs that serve **youth ages 12-18** (Garfield, Miller, Southwest Teen Life, South Lake HS, Meadowbrook, Magnuson, and Bitterlake). This is a **free program** that provides a quiet, safe space to complete their virtual schooling, a healthy meal, access to caring and supportive adults, and opportunity to take part in enrichment activities.

**We need your help getting the word out about this program.**

This program is open to all, but our hope is that you will send this out to your community and networks to reach out to youth who are the furthest from education justice and encourage them to join. Our programs are up and running and we still have space for youth to join.
